Named by the cable network Showtime as one of the five funniest people in America, Hazell was a writer for the sitcom "Seinfeld" and performed as the warm-up entertainment for the live studio audience before the TV tapings. He left the show to strike out on his own as a performer and writer and developed "The Wonder Bread Years," which Jerry Seinfeld calls, "Milk-snorting funny!"
